

PE and Sports Premium Funding

Academic Year 2015-6

Tritlington School has received PESP funding of £8135 in the academic year 2015-16.

During that time we have spent £8000 to continue to be part of the Morpeth and Ponteland School Sports Partnership. This provides us with:

- a Partnership manager who leads and coordinates the running of the partnership
- 2 hours of expert-led curriculum PE for our children over a range of sports and skills
- 1 after-school club available to all children in school from Reception to Year 4, with a variety of activities over the academic year
- 3 sessions of young sports leader training over the year, with the children taking up the opportunity in lessons and playtimes.
- access to a variety of festivals for children from Reception to Year 4 at central venues
- an appropriate framework of competitions that are inclusive to all pupils and all abilities where our pupils can meet peers from other partnership schools as part of their transition process to middle school
- professional development opportunities in PE and sport open to all our teaching staff throughout the academic year.
- the opportunity to develop links with local community sports clubs
- a high quality professional service, tailor-made to our school
- appropriate and relevant information to meet Ofsted criteria and School Games Mark
- transport to partnership events

We have also spent money on:

Curriculum PE sessions

Curriculum PE has continued to be more focused with teaching staff being supported by experts. Effective planning and delivery has allowed a variety of sports to be taught over the academic year including tag rugby, gymnastics, dance, athletics,

football and multi-skills. Participation in lessons has been good; activity levels are high and engagement and enjoyment is very good. The children's skills have improved further and they can articulate what they have been learning. Behaviour during PE lessons is good and the children respond well to the coach.

The effective cooperation between the class teacher and the MPSSP teacher allows the class teacher to follow up on the MPSSP teacher's lesson for the children's 2nd hour of PE each week, allowing for greater breadth of study.

Extra-curriculum sport involvement

The after school club provided as part of the school sports partnership offer has been well attended and a school survey showed that children enjoy the variety of activities offered.

Tiny Woods have continued with football club after school throughout the year offering coaching for children from Reception to Year 4.

After last year's phenomenal success, we decided to sign up again for the annual Children's Cancer Run at Newcastle Racecourse. A large number of our school community took part on May 15th including children, parents and staff.

School life enhancement

Sport and activity during lunch and playtimes is good at Tritlington. To promote the involvement of children in active play, we updated and replenished some of the playground equipment and our Year 4 children have been trained as young sports leaders to enable them to organise and teach games to the younger children.

Planned expenditure for academic year 2016-17

We have decided to continue our involvement with the Morpeth and Ponteland School Sports Partnership for the next academic year. This will provide us with 2 hours of expert-led curriculum PE and 1 after school club per week as well as access to sports competitions, sports festivals and sports CPD open to all our teaching staff throughout the year.

We will look to continue to deliver a variety of high quality, innovative sports activities during the 2016/17 academic year and will explore avenues of funding and fundraising to enable us to do this.
