 - Work together and help each other
- Acknowledge wanted behaviours to build the children's self esteem and confidence.
- Teach the children how to manage their own behaviour
- Apply sanctions calmly and clearly when needed.
- Start each day afresh: "Forgive, Forget and Fresh Start".

We know that clear boundaries help children learn and feel safe. If they are actively involved in creating the rules, they will take ownership. The school's expectations will be shared and reinforced by all.
