

PE and Sports Premium Funding

Academic Year 2013-14

Tritlington First School has received PESP funding of £8000 in the academic year 2013-14.

During that time we have spent £6000 to become part of the Morpeth and Ponteland School Sports Partnership, which provides us with 2 hours of expert-led curriculum PE, 1 after school club, taster sessions of various sports, 2 session of young sports leader training per term as well as access to sports competitions, sports festivals and sports CPD open to all of our teaching staff throughout the year.

We have also spent money on:

- Transport to and from half termly festivals eg football
- Transport to and from swimming classes for two half terms
- Forest school training for all staff

Impact monitored in Academic Year 2013-14

Curriculum PE Sessions:

Curriculum delivery became more focussed with teachers being supported by experts. Participation in school sports lessons at Tritlington is at 100% with pupils reporting high levels of enjoyment and teachers reporting high levels of engagement from all groups of children. Behaviour of children during PE sessions is good and the children have responded well towards the positive role model especially. We have found this to be effective and plan to continue with this model into the next academic year.

One teacher and one teaching assistant took up the offer of PE and Sport CPD this academic year. They reported that they found it useful and their confidence in the quality of their teaching increased following the CPD. We are planning to increase uptake of CPD opportunities during the academic year 2014-15 and will set aside time to allow staff to disseminate information and skills

gained during CPD to the whole teaching staff to ensure good practice and high quality teaching throughout the school.

CPD opportunities will be open to teachers, HLTAs and TAs.

Extra-curricular sport involvement:

Attendance at after school clubs at Tritlington has been variable in the past. As part of our involvement with School Sports Partnership we receive an after school club which has seen an increase in the uptake of sports club provision. 55% of children at Tritlington attended free after school activities during the academic year 2013-14, with 17% of these children being Pupil Premium children. 11% of children attended Football after school club and 75% of these have gone on to enrol at Tiny Woods Academy who run our football after school club. The children involved with football also attended two tournaments organised by Tiny Woods and this was well supported by parents. Following Judo taster sessions in school organised by the School Sports Partnership, 17% of pupils have gone on to enrol with Destination Judo outside of school. The Archery after school club was well attended with 39% of pupils taking part and one child went on to enrol with the archery club outside school. We also ran a Street Dance after school club which was well attended by 33% of pupils.

School Life Enhancement:

Sport and activity during lunch and play times is good at Tritlington, however, we are looking to increase the involvement in active play at break times by updating and replenishing the playground equipment eg the goal posts, zoning the playground, teaching KS1 children how to play simple collaborative games and opening up opportunities for lunch time staff to engage in CPD for promoting an active lunch time.

Academic Year 2014-15

We have continued our involvement with the Morpeth and Ponteland School Sports Partnership, which still provides us with 2 hours of expert-led curriculum PE, 1 after school club, 2 sessions of young sports leaders training per term as well as access to sports competitions, sports festivals and sports CPD open to all of our teaching staff throughout the year.

We also plan to spend money on:

- Transport to and from competitions and half termly festivals
- Transport to and from swimming classes for two half terms
